Questions for Reflection and Application

1. Every married person has experienced singleness, and every single person in Christ will experience being the Bride of Christ. How does this dual reality impact your thinking?
2. What stood out to you from the sermon about the call to disciple?
3. How can you use your opportunities (whether single or married) to disciple others or serve the body of Christ?
4. We can often find our identity in that which describes us rather than that which defines us. What defines us is being in Christ. What describes us is being married, being single, being a parent, or being without children. Why is it important that our identity does not get caught up in what describes us?
5. If you are single, what would you want the married people in the church to understand about your singleness?
6. If you are married, what are some ways you can welcome those who are single into your lives?
7. How can you be more intentional about connecting with those who have a different marital status than you do?
