Questions for discussion and application:

1. In the sermon, we learned about the three tenses of salvation (justification, sanctification, and glorification). Was this new to you?
2. This past week, how have you applied the helmet of salvation in one of these three tenses of salvation? Be specific.
3. What does the term "helmet of salvation" mean in the context of Ephesians 6:17? Why do you think Paul chose a helmet to represent salvation?
4. In what ways does the helmet of salvation provide protection for believers? How does it give you assurance in your spiritual journey?
5. How does the helmet of salvation help you prepare for and engage in spiritual warfare? What are some of the "fiery darts" (Ephesians 6:16) that might target a believer's mind, and how does the helmet of salvation protect against them?
6. The helmet covers the head, which represents the mind. How does salvation shape your mindset and perspective on life? In what ways does it influence your thoughts, decisions, and attitudes?
7. How does wearing the helmet of salvation relate to your identity in Christ? How does knowing that you are saved affect the way you see yourself and interact with others?
8. The helmet of salvation symbolizes the hope and assurance of eternal life. How does this hope influence your daily life and long-term outlook? In what ways can you share this hope with others?
9. How can believers "put on" the helmet of salvation in practical terms? What spiritual disciplines or practices help you maintain a focus on salvation and its implications?
